Please remember as you pray...

- The number of people who have had COVID continues to be high but there is hope that this 5th wave has hit its peak and numbers will soon start to drop. Hospitals continue to be operating at full capacity and our frontline staff are under huge pressure.
- Another week has passed in the conflict between Russia and Ukraine, another week of destruction and death. The number of casualties is not yet known as a theatre sheltering civilians has been shelled. It is believed that there may have been up to 1200 people sheltering in the building. The International Court of Justice (ICJ) has ordered Russia to cease military actions immediately in a 13-2 decision. This includes all activities carried out against the people of Ukraine by the Russians or those representing the Russian forces. Although the court rulings are binding, there are no direct means of enforcing them.
- Researchers have revealed that the Amazon rainforest is moving towards a "tipping point" where trees may die en masse. After years of damage caused by drought, fires and deforestation the rainforest is losing its ability to heal and recover. In the past the rainforest trapped carbons that would add to global warming. Now studies are showing areas of the Amazon emitting more carbon dioxide than can be absorbed.
- The number of fatalities has risen as a result of Cyclone Gombe in Mozambique. Gombe has destroyed thousands of homes and has crippled the infrastructure making it almost impossible to travel by land.
- Throughout the world, several countries and their people are facing a hunger crisis and starvation, in Afghanistan, Yemen, Madagascar, Ethiopia to name just a few. The largest group affected are the most vulnerable the young and the elderly. May we in the developed countries find ways to offer our support to these, the least in greatest need.
- Yet another sector of local employment is coming under the dark shadow of the pandemic. It is feared that at least 150 gyms could close down in the coming months if they can not reopen by 20 April. This comes after the announcement that Fitness First will close all eight branches in Hong Kong.
