Please remember as you pray...

- There has been yet another mass shooting in the U.S. at an Independence Day parade, claiming the lives of seven people and leaving dozens wounded. In the wake of the recent movement to tighten gun control, the shooter was still able to buy five guns. His actions raised the alarm, but it seems the authorities did nothing to stop him. We remember families who are victims of crime and pray that the government will enforce stricter gun controls.
- Ukraine says it is investigating more than 21,000 war crimes allegedly committed by Russia since its invasion. Over 200 300 reports are received daily, which is only on the Ukrainian side. In all situations, we pray for Justice to be done.
- An attack by gunmen on a Nigerian prison has enabled more than 1000 inmates to escape. Around half of those have since returned to prison. Islamic militants are suspected of carrying out the attack, and dozens of jihadists are thought to be among the escapees. This latest breakout only adds to the growing fears among the Nigerian people. We pray for all living in such fear where neighbour suspects neighbour.
- As the situation in Sri Lanka grows dire, president Gotabaya Rajapaksa has reached out to Russia's President Vladimir Putin, creating more debt for the country, after the energy minister announced the country might soon run out of petrol. Daily the people protest on the streets as they struggle to survive this crisis. May they be strengthened and their voices heard.
- Floods have hit Sydney for the third time this year. Parts of the city have received and recorded about eight months of rain in four days. As a result, more than 100 evacuation orders have been issued across Greater Sydney. As folks go into the recovery process, may they be strengthened and encouraged to push on through this again.
- Health officials shared on Wednesday their concerns that the COVID epidemic situation in Hong Kong is getting worse, warning that the hospital services might have

- to be adjusted if things continue to deteriorate further. We pray for those working in the front-line positions and that we all will be encouraged to do our part.
- The Transport Department will initiate a pilot scheme using additional lights at traffic crossings. Following similar systems used on the mainland and overseas, a shining red light will shine onto waiting areas at the crossings to alert people that the "red man" signal is on and they should not cross the road. The scheme aims to help prevent accidents and make those engrossed in their mobile phones more aware of the traffic.
- We are grateful for all the Lord has provided and wonder at all discoveries. The Royal Botanical Gardens have finally identified a new species of giant Water Lily though it has been around for nearly 200 years and mistakenly identified as another species. The newly identified species is native to Bolivia and is named Victoria boliviana. While here in Hong Kong, scientists have discovered three previously-unidentified coral species in the eastern waters of Hong Kong, including one that could be exclusive to the SAR. Our God is so good to us. Let us all do our part to protect and retain what we have been given.
