CONCERNS OF THE CHURCH

God does nothing except in response to believing prayer. – John Wesley Please remember as you pray. . .

- Happy New Year! May we wish everyone peace, joy and good health in 2024. This year, we shall celebrate our church's Centenary, and we look forward to your warm support and eager participation in KUC Where All Are One. May the Lord continue to bless this church, our Pastors, our Council and Trustees, our church leaders and our congregation to serve our community as a beacon of light, love and hope.
- Japan faced a dual catastrophe as a 7.6-magnitude earthquake struck on New Year's Day, leaving 62 people dead and many more trapped under the rubble. The Noto Peninsula on the Sea of Japan coast was particularly devastated, with buildings in towns like Wajima and Suzu reduced to rubble. An aftershock and tsunami warnings added to the challenges. Tragically, on the second day of the new year, a runway collision occurred at Tokyo Haneda airport, involving a Japan Airlines Airbus A350 and a Coast Guard turboprop bound for delivering aid to earthquake victims. While all passengers on the JAL flight miraculously escaped, five of the six Coast Guard crew members lost their lives. In prayer, we lift up the people of Japan, who find themselves grappling with the aftermath of both the earthquake and the tragic aviation incident at the onset of this new year. May they find strength, resilience, and support during these challenging times.
- Amnesty International has issued a stark condemnation of the escalating homophobia in sub-Saharan Africa, where governments are increasingly criminalizing homosexual acts, imposing harsh penalties, and sending a toxic message that LGBTQ+ individuals are criminals. The report reveals that homosexual acts remain illegal in 38 African countries, with South Sudan and Burundi introducing new laws in the last five years. The situation is dire, with violent attacks against LGBTQ+ individuals on the rise, exemplified by the recent beating of Sierra Leonean gay activist George Freeman. Amnesty urges the repeal of these discriminatory laws, emphasizing the need to uphold the human rights and dignity of all Africans. We pray for those facing persecution due to

- their sexual orientation in Africa, seeking understanding, compassion, and a path towards acceptance and equality.
- China has responded to an International Monetary Fund (IMF) warning about the potential detrimental impact of national security restrictions on global growth. The IMF Deputy Managing Director, Gita Gopinath, had expressed concerns that if the world economy divided into two blocs, with the U.S. and Europe in the West and China and Russia in the East, global GDP could suffer a significant decline. Gopinath emphasized that actions such as trade wars, science and technology conflicts, and efforts to decouple or de-risk economies amount to the politicization of economic and trade matters, which is deemed immoral and unsustainable. The situation underscores the need for international cooperation and understanding to foster fair and mutually beneficial economic relationships, promoting global stability and prosperity. In prayer, we seek wisdom and collaboration among nations for the greater good of the international community.
- In Hong Kong, prosecutors alleged on Wednesday that activist and publisher Jimmy Lai encouraged residents to protest and urged the U.S. to take action against Chinese authorities. The 76-year-old media tycoon, arrested in 2020 during a crackdown on pro-democracy protests, faces a national security trial, closely watched for its implications on the city's freedoms and judicial independence. Lai, who has been in jail for over three years, pleaded not guilty to charges of conspiring with foreign countries and publishing seditious material. The trial highlights concerns about freedom of the press and judicial autonomy in Hong Kong. In prayer, we seek justice, the rule of law, and the preservation of freedom of the press, recognizing the importance of these principles for a just and open society.
